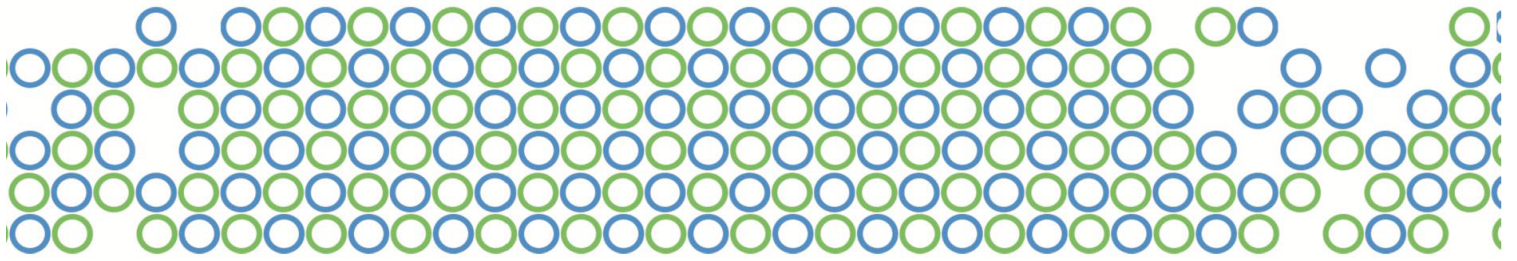

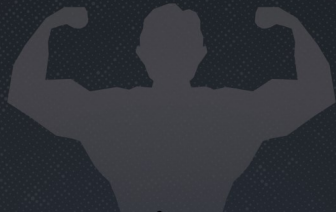

Children and Family Services is committed to ongoing improvement and pursuit of excellence in services to infants, children, youth, and families. In this role, you will apply your related education and gain experiential learning in Child Intervention (CI) Practice.

The Entry Level, Child Intervention Practitioner is a developmental position that sets you on a meaningful career journey within Children and Family Services. Working in collaboration with a team of CI professionals, you will further develop your knowledge and skills as you work toward becoming a fully delegated Child Intervention Practitioner. You will gain confidence in your ability to work collaboratively with families and community partners in the creation of safe environments and identify safety and risk factors within communities and homes. You will strengthen your understanding of the fundamental components in casework, including family dynamics, trauma-informed practice, harm reduction, Signs of Safety, life-long connections, and encouraging families to have input into decisions that affect their lives.

The Entry Level, Child Intervention Practitioner will recognize the importance of working collaboratively with First Nations, Metis and Inuit communities and have a working knowledge of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission calls to action. They also understand the importance of child and family involvement, connection, and collaboration with a large array of other cultures and communities.

BURMAN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS SAFETY DEPARTMENT IS BEGINNING TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR THOSE INTERESTED IN BEING PART OF THE SECURITY TEAM FOR THE 23-24 SCHOOL YEAR.

Campus safety is looking for individuals interested in helping to provide a safer community for their campus family members. Burman security guards are an integral part of the campus safety team and help to provide the campus community with peace of mind that incidents that occur overnight are addressed and that the appropriate people are notified.

Security guards are provided thorough training and are assisted through the process of becoming licensed security guards in the province of Alberta as well as 22 hours of additional on-the-job training required to be successful guards here on campus. We also provide work to students during the summer and over the Christmas break, with preference given to current employees.

Some of the duties of a Burman University security guard include:

- building lockup
- safety checks to watch for maintenance and other emergent issues
- addressing emergency events during their shifts
- checking and ensuring emergency exits and equipment are in proper working order
- opening buildings as required for those needing to enter buildings after hours.
- The ideal candidate for this position would be a student with proven leadership capability, self-driven with strong ethics and a desire to serve their community.

Applicants must:

- be a student of Burman University and have been a student for at least one semester
- have shown good citizenship during their time on campus
- Preference is given to applicants who:
- have a driver's license and can be insured through Burman university's vehicle insurance
- are currently licensed security guards either in Alberta or another province
- have worked previously in positions of responsibility
