Extramural Sport

A. Academic Guidelines

1. Students selected (or those trying out) for the team must be informed at the beginning of the fall semester that eligibility for continuance on the team is that they receive a minimum GPA of 2.00 (college) or 50% (academy) at mid-grading period.
2. Students who have not achieved the minimum GPA requirement will be suspended from the team until the next grading period. At that time if their GPA has reached the minimum requirement they can then be readmitted to the team if there is space available.
3. At the beginning of second semester, students with a GPA lower than 2.0 (college) and 50% (academy) are considered to be in academic jeopardy and will remain off the team until the second semester grading period indicates their GPA has reached the minimum requirement.
4. The GPA is monitored by the Vice President for Student Services in conjunction with the athletic director.

B. Charges

A charge will be administrated to students taking fewer than 9 credits (CUC) or 15 credits (PAA) per semester at the rate of \$10/CUC credit under the minimum of 9 credits, and \$6/PAA credit under the minimum of 15 credits for membership fees. This amount to be in addition to the regular fees charged by the Club itself. If fewer credits are taken during the first semester with the plan to take more credits during second semester so that the yearly average is 9 credits (CUC) and 15 credits (PAA) per semester, then the fee charged will be reimbursed at the end of the second semester.

A budget including fees charged to students is to be submitted at the beginning of the school year.

C. Membership Criteria

1. Grade point average
2. A willing Christian attitude
3. Good Citizenship
4. Cooperative attitude toward coaches and administration
5. Medical clearance for each team member



6. Parental consent in writing from parents for those students under 18 years of age, to be held by the E.S. Coordinator.
 7. Meeting all work/class schedules
- * It was discussed further and voted that a maximum of two engagements be allowed, one only during the week, and one on the weekend. This would involve either a practice or a game. As well, students with low grades can practice when the practices are scheduled outside of study hall, for High School but are not allowed to play in any games. The grades must meet the criteria as set out in Number 1 above by the end of the next 6-week grading period. High school or mid term period (CUC)
